# COLLECTIVE BARGAINING: RATIFICATION

# What is ratification?

Ratification by the union is the process by which members of the bargaining unit vote to accept or reject the terms of the Collective Agreement that the university and union have negotiated.

## When does a ratification vote occur?

• The ratification vote happens at the end of collective bargaining, after the university and the union have reached a tentative agreement.

# What is needed for a tentative Collective Agreement to be considered "ratified"?



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• The Collective Agreement is considered "ratified" by the bargaining unit if a majority (50% +1) of those voting accept the terms of the tentative Collective Agreement.

## Who is eligible to vote during ratification?

• All members of the bargaining unit have the right to vote after they have attended a mandatory information meeting. Members who do not attend an information meeting will not be able to vote. Each person gets one vote. The vote must be conducted by secret ballot.

## Why are members' votes important?

• All members votes are important as each member's vote is vital to the negotiation of our new Collective Agreement. Once our new Collective Agreement is ratified these are the terms and conditions that will govern our members for the duration of the Collective Agreement. Changes to our Collective Agreement can only occur once our current Collective Agreement ends and we begin negotiating our new Collective Agreement.

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# **Ratification Flow Chart**

UWOSA and Western reach a tentative Collective Agreement



Members vote by secret ballot either in favour or against the tentative agreement

The votes are counted, and the results communicated to the members.

If the tentative agreement <u>IS</u> <u>REJECTED, (DID NOT GET 50%+1</u> <u>IN FAVOUR</u> then the tentative agreement will **NOT** be ratified

UWOSA and Western will present counteroffers. Then the UWOSA Negotiation Team will present the new tentative agreement to the membership for another ratification vote. UWOSA communicates back to Western that the tentative Collective Agreement was not accepted

If there is an impasse during negotiations, the Negotiation Team will recommend to the Executive Committee to hold a strike vote If the ratification vote IS IN FAVOUR of the tentative agreement (50%+1 vote FOR the agreement) then the Collective Agreement has been ratified by UWOSA. The tentative agreement is then ratified by Western Administration. Once both parties have ratified the tentative Collective Agreement, it is finalized and implemented.
