

Negotiations Update – July 30, 2021

While UWOSA was prepared to begin bargaining with Western's Administration in mid-May, Western was not prepared to meet until July 9th. We have met with Western's Administration ten times during the month of July.

This week, the Ministry of Labor's appointed Conciliator attended three of the four scheduled negotiation dates with Western Administration. While the Employer's Negotiation team has made an effort to meet with us at each opportunity to present data and to exchange proposals, there has been little movement of significant changes for any of our non-monetary language; however, we are not yet at an impasse.

As we have notified members in previous Negotiations bulletins, UWOSA is limited by Ontario's Bill 124. Western's Administration has no position on the Bill and maintains the provincial legislation.

We currently have five more scheduled dates to bargain with Western's Administration during August, 2021.

To continue to keep Western's Administration focused on bargaining meaningfully with UWOSA, on July 28, 2021, UWOSA requested a "No Board" report from the Ministry of Labor. Once that report is issued, it would put UWOSA and Western Administration in a potential strike/lockout position around late-August. Requests for a "No Board" report are not unusual in labor negotiations and either party can make the request. It does not mean a strike or lockout is inevitable.

Our Negotiations Team is committed to get a fair Collective Agreement as soon as possible despite the restrictions imposed on us by Ontario's Bill 124. We will continue to fight and to demonstrate to Western's Administration that Western works because of UWOSA.

We continue to receive questions about negotiations and thank you for understanding that we cannot disclose any specific details regarding our discussions. We are committed to continue to bargain in good faith and therefore, all discussions must remain confidential.
